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# <u>Overview</u>

Job Profile:	The Staging & Construction Assistant is responsible for supporting and assisting with all physical set elements and effects for Belvoir's produced, presented or supported shows. These shows may be touring works or works within Belvoir venues. When demand requires, there may also be scope to assist on builds for external parties.
	The Staging & Construction Assistant reports to the Head of Construction and works closely with other members of the Workshop and Production team, Stage Management and the Creative Teams of assigned productions.
Hours of work	40 hours per week, hours to be discussed.
Package:	10% employer contribution to superannuation. 20 days annual leave per annum, with 17.5% leave loading payable in addition after 12 months. 10 days personal leave per annum.

### Job Description

The Staging & Construction Assistant will be responsible for:

- 1. Assisting in set construction and prop builds in accordance with the artistic goals of the creative team, as directed by the Head of Construction;
- 2. Managing the staging elements of Belvoir bump outs including the subsequent storage or disposal of staging elements;
- 3. Building and installing rehearsal sets for Belvoir productions;
- 4. Addressing repair and maintenance needs on local and touring productions as identified;
- 5. As directed by the Head of Construction, ensuring the safe and efficient management of the Belvoir workshop and its staff/contractors, in accordance with WH&S requirements;
- Along with the other members of the Production department and the IT & Operations Manager, coordinate occasional maintenance tasks as they relate to equipment and infrastructure at the workshop;
- 7. Ordering and picking up construction materials, equipment and other workshop supplies when required;
- 8. Other ad hoc duties as required.

### Selection Criteria

#### Essential

- Proven general carpentry, construction and metalwork skills;
- Experience in using power tools;
- An understanding of construction plans;
- Sound understanding of WHS policies, as applicable;
- Mechanist expertise and ability to problem-solve;
- Demonstrated ability to work independently and as part of a team;
- Proven ability to work in a dynamic environment, with competing priorities;
- Experience working with a diverse group of stakeholders;
- Excellent written and communication skills;
- High standard of attention to detail and 'follow-through';
- Sound understanding of Microsoft Office Suite, including Word and Excel;
- A valid driver's license.

- Experience in construction within an arts or events organisation will be highly regarded;
- Experience with Risk Assessments and Safe Work Method Statements;
- Experience using AutoCAD for construction and ground plans;
- Experience in theatre bump-ins/bump-outs.
