Job Description

General Responsibilities (non-exhaustive):

- Provide general support and work to the instructions of the Production Manager
- To assist in the management of Belvoir productions from inception to delivery
- To assist in the management of Belvoir transfers and tours
- Work with the Production Manager to maintain artistic quality and ensure best technical practices with account to given budgets and resources
- Administrative support of productions
- Assist with the oversight of Health & Safety practices
- Deputise for the Head of Production as required
- Represent the Belvoir Production Department at meetings and events when required
- Carry out any other duties as reasonably requested

Summary of Specific Responsibilities:

- Administration and accounting of Production petty cash and management of relevant budgets
- Assist in the up-keep of financial records relating to productions, technical projects and storage.
- Administration and co-ordination of props and furniture.
- Assist the Production Manager in researching and costing relevant elements of productions
- Ordering supplies, equipment, transport for productions and projects
- Working alongside Production Manager and department Heads to oversee rehearsals, show builds, production periods, running tasks.
- Working with and alongside members of the creative team to facilitate the design and production process
- Organise the creation of a Production Bible for each production
- In conjunction with the Production Manager liaise with costume, lighting, sound, wigs, construction, stage management, and outside contractors with regard to costing, scheduling and feasibility of projects
